

Playing Revelation Sermons Using Your Laptop or MP3 Device

Dr. Waddell's Revelation sermons (approximately 80 MP3 files) are distributed by the church on one high-capacity disc rather than 80 CDs. Although the disc is a DVD disc, it is not formatted to "play" in a DVD player like a rental movie. The DVD can be thought of as a read-only diskette or flash drive. It contains MP3 sermon files organized in three folders (2010, 2011 and 2012) that are readable by the DVD drive in a laptop or desktop computer.

It is generally best to copy the sermon files from the DVD to your laptop's hard drive. For better audio fidelity, you can play the sermon files from your hard drive using your Windows Media Player to a TV or stereo as shown below.

To connect your laptop to a TV or stereo, you'll generally need one of the cables shown below to join the laptop's headphone jack to the TV or stereo input. Cables are available at Wal-Mart or Radio Shack for a few dollars.

You can also play sermons from a mobile device such as an MP3 player or phone. A \$40 MP3 player is much less expensive and easier to manage than a 80-CD set. Using a computer you can copy the sermon files to your MP3 player or phone as shown below.

The MP3 player should include a USB cable for file transfer as pictured above.

Having transferred the files to a mobile player, you can easily listen to them on a TV or stereo system. Simply connect the headphone jack on the mobile player to the input jack on the TV or stereo system similar to that shown in the first photo. Sermon files play like music files on your mobile device.
